GENERAL OVERVIEW OF THE MONTH

There were **1,166** reported terrorist incidents in **40** different countries in June 2011, versus **1,135** in the preceding month. These incidents claimed **1,708¹** lives, caused **2,268**

injuries, and included **167** abductions. Terrorist incidents intensified in Iraq, Afghanistan, Pakistan, India, Yemen, Mexico, Colombia, Russia, Somalia and Turkey during this period. In June 2011, violence decreased in Iraq roughly 5%, while 4% increase was recorded in Afghanistan. In addition, violence was increased 15% in Pakistan compared to the previous month in terms of the number of attacks during the month. Also, 113 terrorist incidents were recorded in India, while 48 terrorist attacks occurred in Yemen. Lastly 26 incidents were reported from Turkey during the month.

Suicide attack in Logar province left 38 dead and 100 wounded on June 25, 2011.

Logar Province in Afghanistan²


The deadliest attack was vehicle-borne suicide attacks in Logar province, in Afghanistan on June 25, and claimed 38 lives and 100 injuries. The target was a hospital and the incident was Afghanistan's worst attack for three years. The victims were hospital workers and civilians including women and children. The huge blast caused the highest death toll in Afghanistan since a July 2008 car bomb attack on the Indian embassy in Kabul killed more than 60 people.




Chart 1 – Some World Security Trends



IRAQ

In Iraq, **270** terrorism-related incidents were reported for the month of June 2011 and the incidents decreased roughly 5% compared to the previous month. These attacks claimed **294** lives, and wounded **784** others, and included **five** abducted. The deadliest attack was a vehicle-borne improvised explosive device (VBIED) attack in Baghdad on June 23, claiming 23 lives and 107 others injuries. Also, an improvised explosive device (IED) attack in Quadisiyah province on June 21 left 23 dead and 40 others wounded.

In **Baghdad**, 116 terrorist incidents were reported in June 2011. These incidents claimed 110 lives and 370 injuries. The most significant attack for the period was a VBIED attack on June 23, resulted in 23 deaths and 107 injuries.

Seven different methods were used in Baghdad during the month. The most-used method was IED attack, with 68 attacks including 11 VBIED attacks. In total, IED attacks claimed 66 lives and 347 injuries. The second-most prevalent method was armed attack with 36 incidents resulting in 31 deaths and 17 injuries. Also, five indirect fire (IDF) attacks caused five people dead and two wounded. Three people were executed in three separate attacks, while four people were killed and four others were wounded in three separate raids. Lastly, a clash on June 15, claimed one life during the month.

Mosul province was the second worst-hit province during the period, with 42 attacks. In total, 40 people were killed, 90 others were wounded. The most significant attack was June 11 VBIED attack, targeted soldiers, resulted in six deaths and 60 wounded. Six different methods were used in the province during the period. IED attack including three VBIED attacks, with 20 instances, was the most used methodology in the province claimed 18 lives and 83 injuries. The second most important method was armed attack with 12 attacks, resulting in 13 deaths and one injury, while six people were executed in five separate incidents. Also, four IDF attacks left two dead and six wounded, while a clash caused one soldier dead in Mosul province during the month.

Kirkuk was the third worst hit province in Iraq in June 2011, with 26 separate attacks, leaving 10 dead, 24 wounded, and included five abducted. The deadliest attack was June 26 IED attack, caused two civilian dead and five others wounded.

Five different methodologies were used in Kirkuk during the month, and the most-used method was IED attack with eight instances, resulted in three deaths and 10 injuries. The second most prevalent method was armed attack, with seven instances, claimed four lives and four injuries. Also, five people were abducted in five separate incidents, while three IDF incidents caused 10 people wounded. Lastly, three civilians were executed in separate three attacks in Kirkuk province during the period.

Diala province was the fourth worst hit province during the month, with 24 incidents. These attacks claimed 20 lives and 60 injuries. The most significant attack for the period was a VBIED attack on June 14, resulted in three deaths and 28 injuries.

Five different tactics were used in Diala province during the month, and the most prevalent method for the period was IED attack, including six VBIED attacks, with 16 incidents, claiming 14 lives and 56 injuries. Also, five armed attacks caused five dead and four wounded, while two suicide attacks caused no casualties. Lastly, a government official was executed in Diala province during the month.

Salah al-Din province was the fifth worst hit region in which 16 separate incidents claimed 56 lives, and 113 injuries. The deadliest attack was June 3 IED attack, resulted in 15 deaths and 61 injuries in the province.


Five methods were used during the period in Salah al-Din province. The most used method was IED attack, with six incidents, left 18 dead and 82 wounded. Also, six armed attack claimed 13 lives and one injury, while two suicide attacks left 18 dead and 30 wounded during the period, while a clash resulted in three deaths. Lastly, four civilians were executed in the province during the period.



AFGHANISTAN

In June 2011, **233** terrorist incidents were reported in **Afghanistan**. These attacks claimed **350** lives and caused **418** injuries. Also **two** people were abducted during the same period. The number of terrorist incidents increased 4% compared to the previous month. The deadliest attack for the month was a vehicle-borne suicide attack in Logar province caused 38 dead and 100 wounded on June 25.

Terrorists targeted 31 provinces in Afghanistan during the month. **Kandahar** was the country's most hardest hit province, with 28 separate attacks, leaving 38 dead and 20 wounded. The deadliest attack was June 11 IED attack that killed 15 civilians and wounded one in Kandahar.

A total of five different methods were used in the province during the period. IED attack including two VBIED attacks was the most used method, with 13 separate attacks, killing 26 and wounding 13 people, while nine armed attacks claimed eight lives and seven injuries. Also, five clashes caused four dead, while a suicide attack was foiled in Kandahar province during the month.

Helmand was the second most vulnerable province in the country, with 24 separate attacks that killed 28 people and wounded eight. The deadliest attack was June 30 IED attack, left six people killed in Helmand province.

In Helmand, the most used methods was IED attack including a VBIED attack, with 11 instances, claimed 14 lives and eight injuries, while nine armed attacks resulted in 12 deaths. Also, two clashes caused no casualties, while a suicide attack left one policeman dead. Lastly, an IDF attack claimed one life in the province during the month.

Ghazni province was the third hit province in the country, with 17 attacks, claimed 24 lives, 23 injuries. The deadliest attack for the month was a suicide attack in Ghazni province on June 22, claimed six lives.

In all, terrorists in the province used five different methods. IED attack was the most used method with 13 occurrences in Ghazni province, resulting in 13 deaths and 21 wounded, while an armed attack claimed four lives. In addition, a suicide attack caused six dead, while a raid left one dead and two wounded. Lastly, a clash caused no casualties in the province during the month.

Nangarhar province saw 16 attacks during the month, in which 25 people were killed and eight were wounded. The deadliest attack for the month was an armed attack in Nangarhar province on June 8, left nine people killed and six wounded.

Five different methods were used in Nangarhar province. Seven armed attacks resulted in 15 deaths and eight injuries, while four IED attacks caused five dead. Also, three clashes left two dead. Lastly, three civilians were executed on June 17, while an arson attack caused no casualty during the period.

Logar province was the fifth most violent province in Afghanistan during the month. 10 separate attacks resulted in 55 deaths and 112 injuries. The deadliest attack for the month was a vehicle-borne suicide attack in the province on June 25, left 38 dead and 100 wounded.


In all, seven different methods were used in Logar province, and IED attack was the most prevalent methodology during the period with three attacks, killing three people and wounding three others, while 12 people were executed in two separate incidents. Also, two clashes caused two one dead and three wounded, while an armed attack resulted in six wounded. In addition, a suicide attack left 38 killed and 100 wounded, while an arson attack caused no casualty. Lastly, a politician was abducted in the province during the month.



PAKISTAN

197 terrorist incidents occurred in **Pakistan** in June 2011, claiming **295** lives and causing **426** injuries, and including **seven** abducted. The violence level increased roughly 15% in Pakistan compared to the previous month. The deadliest attack was June 11 suicide attack in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province, killing 32 people and wounding 95 others. Also, a clash in the same province claimed 30 lives on June 2.

The terrorists hit seven provinces in Pakistan during the month and **Sindh** province was the worst hit region, with 75 different attacks, claiming 82 lives and 133 injuries. The deadliest incident was June 16 armed attack in the province, resulting in seven civilian deaths. In addition, June 3 clash caused six policemen dead and 11 others wounded in the province during the month.

In all, terrorists used eight different methodologies in the province, leading with armed attack, with 33 occurrences, resulting in 44 deaths and 23 wounded, while 30 people were executed in 24 separate incidents. Also, five IED attacks left 37 wounded, while four IDF attacks left one dead and 56 wounded. In addition, three hoaxes were reported from province, while three arson attacks caused no casualties. Lastly, two clashes left seven dead and 16 wounded, a raid claimed one injury in Sindh province.

Baluchistan was the second most hit province, with 44 incidents, claiming 36 lives and 61 injuries, and including four abductions. The most significant attack in Baluchistan was June 18 IED attack in which three people were killed and 17 others wounded.

Seven different tactics were used in Baluchistan province, and IED attack including two VBIED attack was the most used method, with 16 incidents, resulting in six deaths and 42 wounded, while 16 armed attacks left 17 dead and 10 wounded. Also, four arson attacks caused no casualties, while five people were executed in separate three executions. In addition, three IDF attacks claimed eight lives and nine injuries. Lastly, four people were abducted in two separate incidents in the province during the month.

Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province saw the third highest number of attacks in the country, with 36 separate attacks that killed 127, wounded 175 people and abducted two. The deadliest attack was June 11 suicide attack in the province claimed 32 lives and 95 injuries.

Seven different methods used in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province, and the most used method was IED attack with 16 occurrences caused 30 dead and 42 wounded. The second most prevalent method was armed attack, with six occurrences, leaving nine dead and 17 wounded, while four IDF attacks claimed three lives and four injuries. Also, three clashes left 30 dead, while three raids caused 19 dead and 12 wounded. In addition, two suicide attacks resulted in 36 deaths and 100 wounded, while two people were abducted in two separate attacks in the province during the period.

Federally Administered Tribal Areas (FATA) province saw 35 incidents during the month, in which 45 people lost their lives, 39 others were wounded, and included one abducted. The deadliest incident was June 8 IDF attack in the province, killing eight soldiers.

A total of nine different methods were used in FATA province during the period. IED attack was the most used method, with 11 separate attacks, killing six people and wounding 13, while nine clashes resulted in 16 deaths and 14 wounded. In addition, four IDF attacks claimed 11 lives and two injuries, while three people were executed in separate three incidents. In addition, two raids left seven dead and six wounded, while two armed attacks left one dead. Moreover, two arson attacks caused no casualties, while a suicide attack claimed one life and four injuries. Lastly, an engineer was abducted in the province during the period.

Punjab was the fifth worst hit province, with four attacks, causing four dead, 12 wounded. The June 26 suicide attack was the most significant incident in the province, killing three people and wounding six. Three different methodologies were used in Punjab province and suicide attack was the most used with two incidents, killing four people and wounding 12. Also, an IED attack and an armed attack caused no casualties. Lastly, two IED attacks caused no casualties in **Islamabad**, while a government official was executed in **Gilgit-Baltistan** during the month.



THE MIDDLE EAST

Along with Iraq, Yemen, Iran, Israel, and Saudi Arabia suffered from terrorist attacks in June 2011. Excluding Iraq, 53 incidents were reported in the region during the period. The deadliest attack in Middle East was June 29 VBIED attack in Abyan province in Yemen, killing 30 and wounding 12 soldiers.

The worst hit country in the Middle East was **Yemen**, with 48 separate incidents, leaving 134 dead and 135 wounded. Also, 10 soldiers were abducted by al-Qaeda terrorists during the month. Seven different methods were used in Yemen during the period, and the most prevalent was clash, with 26 occurrences, claiming 62 lives and 41 injuries, and also six IED attacks including two VBIED attacks left 36 dead and 24 wounded. Also, six IDF attacks left 15 dead and 44 wounded, while five armed attacks claimed 17 lives and 14 injuries. Lastly, four raids resulted in four deaths and 12 wounded, while 10 soldiers were abducted in Yemen during the month.

Another country, hit in the region, was **Iran**. Two clashes caused no casualties in Iran during the month. Also, in **Israel** two IDF attacks resulted in three deaths in Israel, while an armed attack in **Saudi Arabia** caused two dead and one wounded during the period.



In Africa, 11 countries were hit by various terrorist acts during June 2011.

Among these countries, **Somalia** saw the most activity, with 28 separate attacks, resulting in 83 deaths and 114 wounded. The deadliest incident was June 2 clash in Mogadishu, in Somalia in which 17 people were killed and 46 others wounded.

Eight different methodologies were used in Somalia, and the most used method was clash, with 12 instances, which resulted in 47 deaths and 64 wounded, while five armed attacks caused 18 dead and 19 wounded. Also, three IED attacks resulted in six deaths and 11 wounded, while three people were executed in two separate incidents. In addition, a suicide attack left one person dead and five others wounded, while two raids occurred with no casualty. Lastly, an IDF attack claimed eight lives and 15 injuries, while a piracy attempt foiled in Somalia during the month.

Nigeria was the second most hit country in Africa with 14 incidents. 14 separate terrorist attacks left 63 dead and 58 others wounded in the country. IED was the most used tactic in Nigeria with seven repetitions, resulting in 52 deaths and 35 wounded, while two armed attacks claimed three lives and six injuries. Also, two suicide attacks resulted in four deaths, while a clash caused two dead and three wounded. In addition, a raid claimed 14 injuries. Lastly, two people executed in an incident in Nigeria during the month.

Eight attacks in **Algeria** put the country in Africa the third most targeted country in June 2011. In all, 10 people were killed and 11 others wounded. Four different methodologies were used in Algeria, and the most used one was IED attack, with five instances, resulting in seven deaths and six wounded, while an armed attack left two killed and five wounded. Also, a soldier was executed, while a clash occurred with no casualty in Algeria during the month.

Six terrorist attacks were seen in **Sudan**, killing 45, wounding 11 others. The deadliest attack was June 14 armed attack in Juba, claiming 29 lives. Four different methodologies were used in the country. Three armed attacks claimed 34 lives and 11 injuries, while a raid resulted in 11 deaths. Also, a clash occurred with no casualty and three civilian abducted in Sudan during the period.

Three attacks in **Burundi** claimed two lives and two wounded and two different attack types were used during the month. Two armed attacks caused a life and two wounded, while a clash, resulted in a policeman dead.

Three terrorist incidents happened in **Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC)**. A raid resulted in two deaths and a person abducted during the raid. Also, an armed attack claimed two lives while, a journalist executed during the month.

In **Kenya**, 11 soldiers injured in an IED attack, while a raid claimed 11 lives and two injuries.


Lastly, a driver abducted in **Egypt**, while a clash occurred with two dead and five wounded in **Mali**. And an IED attack in **Zimbabwe** without any casualty, while a clash happened in **Niger** during the month.

EUROPE

Seven countries suffered from terrorism in Europe in June 2011.



Russia was the leading country with 33 terrorist attacks, which killed 26 and wounded 49. The deadliest incident was clash in Dagestan province on June 21, caused seven dead and 16 wounded.

In all of Russia, five different methods were used during the period. Armed attack was the most prevalent methodology with 11 occurrences, caused nine dead and five wounded, while 10 clashes resulted in 14 deaths and 36 injuries. Also, nine IED attacks claimed one life and eight injuries, while two people executed in two incidents and hoaxes were reported from Russia during the month.

Turkey was the second most hit country with 26 attacks in June 2011. 19 IED attacks resulted in four deaths and 21 injuries, while three clashes occurred with one injury. Also, two IDF attacks occurred with one injury, while an armed attack left one death and three wounded. Lastly, a civilian abducted in an incident in Turkey.




United Kingdom (UK) was hit eight times in June 2011; these attacks claimed no life but an injury. Five IED attacks, a hoax incident, an armed attack with an injury and a cyber attack were reported from **UK**. Also, an IED was defused in **Ireland**. In **Ukraine**, two hoaxes were occurred during the month. In addition, a VBIED attack claimed one life. Lastly, an IED attack was reported from **Spain** with no casualty during the month.

ASIA

In **Asia**, 10 countries saw terrorist attacks in June 2011. Among these, Afghanistan, Pakistan, India, Thailand, Philippines and were the worst hit countries in terms of the number of attacks, with 233, 197, 113, 24 and 21 respectively.


Table 12 –Incidents per Country in Asia in June 2011.

In June 2011, there were 113 terrorist incidents in **India**. These incidents claimed 69 lives and caused 38 injuries, and included 116 abducted. The deadliest attack was June 9 IED attack in India, in Chhattisgarh province, left 10 dead and three wounded.



Eight different methods were used in India during the period. IED attack was the most prevalent method, with 33 occurrences, causing 17 dead and 15 wounded. Secondly, clashes claimed six lives and seven injuries in 26 separate incidents, while 19 armed attacks, claimed 21 lives and four injuries. In addition, 16 people were executed in 12 separate executions, while seven arson attacks occurred with three injuries. Also, 116 people were abducted in six incidents, 100 tribal people were abducted by CPI-Maoists in an incident, and five raids claimed nine lives and two wounded from India during the month. Lastly, five IDF attacks resulted in seven injuries.

In total, 15 different provinces saw terrorist incidents in India during the month. **Jammu&Kashmir** saw 21 separate attacks that caused four killed and 10 wounded. The second most-active province was **Jharkhand** with 20 attacks, leaving six killed and eight wounded. Also, **Chhattisgarh** saw 17 incidents in which 29 people killed, eight wounded and included 100 abducted. In addition, 12 terrorist incidents in **Bihar** left six dead and four abducted, while **Assam** saw 11 incidents which caused no casualty. Moreover, two people were killed and two people were abducted in 10 separate incidents in **Manipur**, while eight attacks claimed 11 lives, five in **Maharashtra**. Furthermore, four attacks caused two dead in **Odisha**, while three attacks resulted in three killed and five wounded in **Nagaland**. Two incidents reported from **West Bengal** that killed one civilian. Three police were killed and two others wounded in **Meghalaya**. **Tripura, Mizoram, Madhya Pradesh** and **Andhra Pradesh** were other provinces afflicted with terrorism during June 2011.

In **Thailand**, 24 separate incidents claimed 12 lives and 39 injuries. The deadliest attack in Thailand was June 24 IED attack, killing two people and wounding five others. In all, six different methods were used in Thailand in June 2011, and IED attack was the most prevalent with 10 incidents, which left four dead and 25 wounded. Additionally, eight armed attacks resulted in seven deaths and six wounded, while five people were wounded two separate IDF attacks. Also, two clashes claimed one life, while a raid occurred with three injuries in the country. Lastly, a civilian was executed in Thailand during the period.

In all, Narathiwat province was the worst-hit region with 12 attacks, claiming five lives and 21 injuries, while six attacks in Yala province left four dead and eight wounded. Also, six

incidents in Pattani province claimed three lives and seven injuries, while three people were injured in an incident in Bangkok June 2011.

Philippines, 21 separate incidents claimed 10 lives, 24 injuries and included seven abducted. In total five different methods were used in Nepal in June 2011. Armed attack was the most prevalent with seven incidents, which caused seven dead and three wounded. In addition, six IED attacks resulted in two dead and 18 injuries. Also, seven people were abducted in three attacks, while one person was killed and another wounded in three clashes. Lastly, two IDF attacks claimed two injuries during the month.

A total of 15 attacks claimed three lives, four injuries and included six abducted in the **Nepal** in June 2011. Four different methods were used in Nepal, and IED attack was the most prevalent methodology with seven incidents, claiming three injuries, while four armed attacks left two dead and one wounded. Also, six people were abducted in three incidents. Lastly, a police found dead in an incident in Nepal during the month.


Four IED attacks caused one death in **Myanmar**, while three terrorist attacks occurred with an injury in **Indonesia**. An IED was defused In **Bangladesh**, while a civilian was executed in **Sri Lanka** during the period.

THE AMERICAS

In Americas, seven countries saw terrorist attacks in June 2011.

Mexico was the most hit country with 45 incidents, leaving 217 dead and nine wounded, and a journalist was abducted. The deadliest attack was an armed attack in Nuevo Leon province on June 16, claimed 33 lives. Five different methodologies were used in Mexico and the most prevalent one was execution with 25 incidents, resulting in 138 deaths, while 14 armed attacks caused 76 dead and four wounded. Also, four clashes occurred with two deaths and two wounded. In addition, an IDF attack claimed one life and three wounded, while abduction was reported from Mexico during the period.

Also, 35 incidents made **Colombia** the most hit second country in Americas, claimed 56 lives, 92 injuries and included seven abducted. The deadliest attack was armed attack on June 25 in Nariño province, resulted in eight deaths and four injuries. Eight different methodologies used in Colombia. Armed attack was the most used one with 13 incidents, leaving 30 dead and 30 wounded, while seven IED attacks, including two VBIED attacks, resulted in five deaths and in 17 injuries. Also, six clashes caused 10 killed and five wounded, while seven people were abducted in four incidents. Moreover, seven people were killed and 22 others wounded in two raid incidents, while two IDF attacks claimed 18 injuries and four people executed during the period.

In addition, four incidents reported from **USA** two of them were cyber attacks that attacked FBI website and IMF. The others were raid that foiled by soldiers and a hoax. Three clashes occurred with no casualty in **Brazil**. **El Salvador**, **Guatemala** and **Peru** are the other countries that saw the terror incidents during the period.
