Türkiye declared her intention to establish COE-DAT in December 2003. Following a preparation period of the Memorandum of Understanding, COE-DAT was officially inaugurated on 28 June 2005. COE-DAT met the criteria set by Allied Command Transformation (ACT), was accredited by NATO, and gained "International Military Organization" status on 14 August 2006. Currently, 7 NATO nations (Türkiye, Albania, Germany, Hungary, Italy, Romania and the United States) are taking part in COE-DAT.

Since its establishment COE-DAT has been actively contributing to CT challenges by conducting courses, mobile education and training activities, seminars, and workshops for the members of NATO, Partnership for Peace (PfP), Mediterranean Dialogue (MD), Partners Across the Globe (PatG), Istanbul Cooperation Initiative (ICI), relevant International Organizations (IOs), and countries with which Türkiye has a bilateral relationship.





COE-DAT supports and contributes to NATO's Counter Terrorism efforts and transformation by functionally aligning itself to cover three main roles:

- As a NATO Education and Training Facility running courses, Mobile Education Teams, and Seminars,
- As NATO's Department Head for Counter Terrorism, and
- As a strategic level Centre of Excellence (think tank) cooperating with Academia and Researchers.





Courses

Since 2005, COE-DAT has conducted 324 activities. To date, 14,796 participants from 122 countries and over 3,471 lectures from 70 countries have taken part in our activities.

Mobile Education and Training

COE-DAT spans the globe with mobile education and training teams that bring education to other nations to meet their individual training needs. Since 2007, COE-DAT conducted 31 METs in 20 countries.

Workshops and Seminars

Since 2005, COE-DAT has hosted workshops and seminars forming a global platform to exchange subject matter experts views on CT issues to enhance NATO's understanding of current challenges. This year COE-DAT will hold several workshops examining different challenges on the field of Defence Against Terrorism. In addition, COE DAT will conduct DAT Executive Level Seminar and "Terrorism Experts Conference" as one of its flagship event of the year.

TERRORISM EXPERTS CONFERENCE & DAT EXECUTIVE LEVEL SEMINAR

In 2025 COE-DAT is going to conduct the annual Terrorism Experts Conference (TEC) combined with the Executive Level Seminar (ELS) on Defence Against Terrorism which cover CT related subjects and discusses latest trends in Terrorism and Counter Terrorism.

Aim of the combined event is:

- to provide senior officers an opportunity to update their understanding of terrorism from preeminent experts in relevant fields,
- to reflect on the role of terrorism in international relations and conflict,
- to prepare attendees to make sense of international developments and respond with better policy and strategy.

Participation:

The conference brings together participants such as:

- Senior Commanders and Flag Officers (OF5 and above),
- CT Practitioners on the executive level (OF2 to OF4), that should be working in domains such as counterterrorism, intelligence, operations, plans, training, force protection, PSYOPS, INFO OPS,STRATCOM, public affairs, police, law enforcement, judicial etc. (Rank exceptions are considered on the basis of operational/ academic experience.),
- International and national CT experts from academia, think tanks,
- Academics and researchers from various international organizations,
- Universities,
- Military educational institutions,
- Security institutions,
- Think-tanks.

The event is open to selected individuals from NATO, NATO partner countries (such as Partnership for Peace, Mediterranean Dialogue, Istanbul Cooperation Initiative, Partners across the Globe), and international organizations (such as the United Nations, European Union, and Organization for Security and Co-operation in Europe).





LESSONS LEARNED
